



**Response Information – 288 Total Responses for NOVEMBER 2011**

Overall, CCF&R responded to 288 separate calls during the month of November 2011. These calls included fire (3), rescue and medicals (192), motor vehicle accidents (23), hazardous situations (5), public assists (9), good intent (40), false alarms (13), other (3).

Comparing the same time period in 2010, there was a total of 274 calls, which is an increase of 11 calls between 2011 and 2010. The number of calls by type was different between years (year-to-date) for rescue and medicals (up to 2068 from 1983), MVA's (up to 252 from 246), fire (down to 151 from 157), public assists (down to 131 from 151), and good intent calls (down to 398 from 406). A year-to-date comparison (YTD 2011 vs. YTD 2010) reveals an increase in calls to 3191 from 3139.

The majority of November, 2011 calls were responded to by **Station 27** with 159 calls, followed by **Stations 26** with 42 calls, **Station 24** with 35 calls, **Station 23** with 18 calls, **Station 21** with 15 and **Station 22** with 4 calls.

The majority of the responses were made by **R27** (90 unit responses), **E27** (77 unit responses), and **TO26** (61 unit responses). (R27 calls do not include any for AMR.)

**General Response Statistics**

During November, 2011, the Cities of **Battle Ground** had 143 calls (140 calls in October 2010), **La Center** 12 calls (9 calls in 2010), **Ridgefield** 26 calls (18 in 2010), and the **outlying** response area 107 calls (106 in 2010).

According to the Standard of Cover, 90% of Urban Calls should be made within six minutes, 90% of Suburban Calls should be made within eight minutes, and 90% of Rural Calls should be made within ten minutes. As of YTD November, 2011, CCF&R was at 88.8% for Urban Calls, 74.7% for Suburban Calls, and 77.7% for Rural Calls.

“**A**” shift responded to the most calls with **126**, “**C**” shift responded to **85**, and “**B**” shift to **77**. Year-to-date “**A**” shift has the most number of calls (A = 1113, B = 1044, and C = 1033).

During November, 2011, CCF&R received **8 mutual aid responses** and gave **5 mutual aid responses**. This data is based on calls run together by CCF&R and the other districts. It does not include calls run only by other districts in CCF&R's area.
